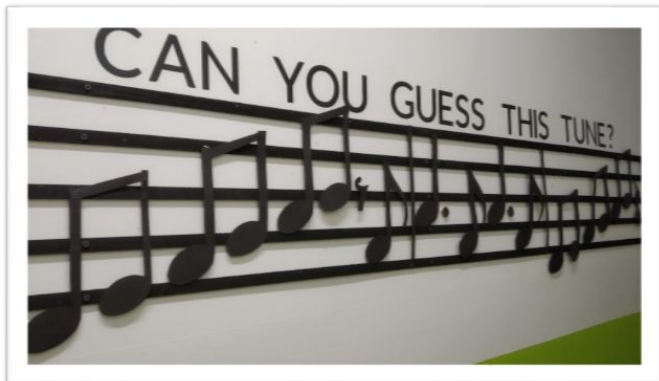
PE
